INTRODUCTION

The Dranetz HDPQ DataNode - Model MVB, also called HDPQ-DN-MVB, is an eight-channel power quality and energy instrument that can be installed in a permanent or temporary installation. All user interactions are performed remotely by using compatible server software, either through a wired Ethernet or Wireless (WiFi) (optional) connection. The HDPQ-DN-MVB can monitor and record data on four voltage channels as well as four current channels simultaneously.

Dranetz HDPQ-DN-MVB is designed to meet both the IEEE 1159 and IEC 61000-4-30 Edition 3 Class A standards for accuracy and measurement requirements. It can do PQ-optimized acquisition of power quality related disturbances and events. Compliance standards such as EN50160 are also supported.

The HDPQ-DN-MVB allows you to customize threshold settings for power quality, energy and demand. It can monitor power quality and energy/demand phenomena for troubleshooting and/or compliance purposes. It can also record inrush conditions, carry out long-term statistical studies to establish performance baselines, and perform field-based equipment testing and evaluation for commissioning and maintenance. The HDPQ-DN-MVB firmware integrates an intuitive instrument setup procedure to ensure the capture of all relevant data for additional post process analysis, report writing, and data archiving using the Dranetz PQView® DE or PQView® web-enabled applications.

This Quick Reference Guide

This Quick Reference Guide contains instructions for the basic operation of the Dranetz HDPQ DataNode - Model MVB with Safety Banana Jack/Hypertronic connectors. Other models are available that support different types of physical circuit connections.

GETTING STARTED

Connecting to Power Source

Power Specifications

The power supply inputs are rated 90–250 VAC 50/60 Hz and 100-300 VDC. A screw terminal block is used to connect up to #12 AWG gauge wire for the power input connections. The positive and negative inputs are fused internally and the fuses are not user-replaceable.

CAUTION

Operation of the HDPQ DataNode from a voltage source other than the rated voltage input stated on the unit nameplate can cause damage to the unit.

Safety Disconnects

The mains supply power to the HDPQ DataNode must be installed downstream from a switched current limiting device. The circuit protection device should be 20 Amps or less, and must be rated for the available voltage and fault current; 5 Amps fuses are preferred.

WARNING

All mains supply conductors connected to the HDPQ DataNode must originate at circuit breakers or fuses rated 20 Amps or less.

You must provide a method for manually removing power from the HDPQ DataNode such as a clearly labeled circuit breaker or a fused disconnect switch.

The AC/DC power input is found at the rear panel of the unit. The rear panel for DataNode Model HDPQ-DN-MVB is shown below.



Power Source

The rear panel marking provides information about the input power rating.

Voltage range: 90-250 VAC, 100-300 VDC

Frequency: 50/60 Hz.Power Consumption: 25 W.

Step	Action
1	With all power OFF, connect the green ground wire to Safety (Earth) ground first before making any other connections.
2	Connect the positive (+) terminal of the mains supply to the positive (+) terminal of the instrument, AC or DC using the appropriate color coding and wire up to #12 AWG wire.
3	Connect the negative (-) terminal of the mains supply to the negative (-) terminal of the instrument, AC or DC using the appropriate color coding and wire up to #12 AWG wire.
4	Turn the power switch of the instrument to ON position.

Controls, Indicators and Connectors

Top View and Front View



Top Panel

The top panel shows the user replaceable Battery compartment.

Internal Battery

Sealed, rechargeable NiMH (Nickel Metal Hydride) cell

The unit will always operate on the normal power source 50/60Hz, 90-250VAC or 100-300VDC. In the event of loss of power, the unit will seamlessly switch to the internal battery backup and will switch back to the normal power source when restored.

Front Panel

The front panel shows the following three (3) LED indicators:

Status Indicator



LED will blink in a heartbeat fashion when power switch is turned on and the unit is operating normally.

Monitoring On Indicator



LED will light steadily if monitoring is on. Monitoring is off when light is off.


Battery Indicator



LED will light steadily when operating on battery backup.

Rear View

This section describes the rear view panel of the HDPQ-DN-MVB.



- **Digital Input (optional)** use to monitor on/off-type digital signals, such as breaker or switch position indicators.
- **Ethernet Port** use to connect a wired Ethernet (RJ45) network. An Ethernet cross over cable may be required to connect directly to a computer when not using a network.
- **USB/Micro-USB Port** use for file transfer to a USB flash drive or directly to a computer.
- Reset Button use to reset the instrument settings to factory defaults. See section Reset to Factory Defaults for details on how to manually reset the instrument to factory configuration.
- **Power Switch** use to turn unit power on or off. Power indicator lamp on front panel flashes when unit is on.
- 6 IRIG-B Input (optional) use as external time sync signal.
- **GPS Port (optional)** input for GPS antenna for time sync.
- WiFi Antenna (optional) use for wireless connectivity via a factory-installed WiFi card (not user installable).
- 9 **Power Input** use to connect AC/DC power.
- Voltage/Current Input Connectors use to connect Safety
 Banana Jack/Hypertronic connectors for voltage and current probe
 connections. See section Connecting the Voltage and Current
 Connectors for circuit connection details.

Reset to Factory Defaults

Resetting the instrument to factory defaults will erase all user data, communication settings, including recorded logs and events, reports and instrument setup files.

The steps below show how to manually reset the HDPQ DataNode to factory configuration.

NOTE: The reset button is recessed and can be found at the rear panel of the instrument. A paper clip, pin or similar item is needed to press in the reset button.

Step	Action	
1	Unfold the paper clip to form at least a 1-inch long straight line wire.	
2	Gently insert the paper clip (or other tool) into the "Reset" button hole at the rear panel of the HDPQ DataNode. Press in the internal reset button and hold for ten (10) seconds. Continue to hold until the Status LED indicator at the front	
	panel stops blinking which indicates that the reset and reboot process has been initiated. If you let go before 10 seconds, the unit will reboot but it will not reset.	
3	Once reboot is completed, the Status LED indicator will blin in a heartbeat fashion to indicate that the unit has returned to normal operation.	
	At this point, the instrument has been reset to factory configuration, including the following default connection settings:	
	Default User name: admin	
	Default Password: Dranetz	
	Wired Ethernet IP address will be fixed at 192.168.0.30.	
	NOTE : All saved data and setups will be lost when you reset the instrument settings to factory defaults.	

Connecting to the HDPQ DataNode

PQView® DE is web-enabled server software that serves as the primary user interface for monitoring systems that include the HDPQ DataNode.

PQView® DE is used for monitoring setups and automatically communicates with the HDPQ DataNode and other instruments, downloads recorded data, and is able to display charts, graphs and reports.

The HDPQ DataNode has an administrative web interface for communications and other instrument configurations. This web interface is used to properly configure the instrument for use on the network in order to establish communications with the server software. Refer to the procedures in the next sections to connect to the HDQP DataNode to change communication and other settings.

In order to connect to the HDPQ DataNode, you must know the IP address and the password of the instrument. Both your computer and the instrument must be properly configured for use in the intended networks. Once properly configured, connecting is a matter of launching the web browser on your computer, entering the IP address, then entering the user name and password when prompted.


The next sections describe how to connect to the HDPQ DataNode via:

- Wired Ethernet connection
- Wireless (WiFi) connection (available as an option)
- A proprietary Dranetz HDPQ IP Setup utility program if the IP Address is not known

Connecting via Wired Ethernet Connection

The steps below show how to connect to the HDPQ DataNode via a wired Ethernet connection.

Step	Action		
1	Connect an Ethernet cable between your Windows®-enabled computer and the Ethernet port at the rear panel of the instrument. An Ethernet cross-over cable may be needed if the computer cannot auto-detect direct cabling.		
2	Connect the power source at the rear panel of the instrument.		
3	Power ON the computer and then press the power switch of the HDPQ DataNode located at the rear panel to turn the instrument ON.		
4	In order to complete the Ethernet connection, the computer IP address needs to be changed to be in the same range as the HDPQ DataNode address. Once the computer is fully running and the IP address has been configured, open the Internet browser and enter the following into the web browser: http://192.168.0.30/index.html.		
	If communications to the instrument are working properly, the window below will be displayed prompting you to enter the user name and password. Enter the default User name: admin Enter the default Password: Dranetz User name and password are case sensitive, and must be entered as shown.		
	Windows Security The server 10.0.1.189 is asking for your user name and password. The server reports that it is from Microsoft-WinCE. Warning: Your user name and password will be sent using basic authentication on a connection that isn't secure. User name Password Remember my credentials OK Cancel		
	When done entering the user name and password, click on the OK button.		



Connecting via Wireless (WiFi) Connection

The steps below show how to connect to the HDPQ DataNode via a Wireless (WiFi) connection.

NOTE: The steps below can be done only if the WiFi option is installed and a WiFi antenna is connected to the rear panel of the HDPQ instrument. WiFi is an optional feature and must be factoryinstalled (not user installable).

Step Action

PRE-REQUISITE STEPS FOR FIRST TIME CONNECTION TO WIFI:


For first-time configuration of Wireless (WiFi) settings, it is necessary to connect to the HDPQ DataNode via Wired connection first to enable and to set up the WiFi connection to the instrument.

Refer to the previous section Connecting via Wired Ethernet Connection on page 14 and follow Steps 1 to 5.

Once the HDPQ DataNode Home Page is displayed, follow the steps below to set up WiFi connection to the instrument.

1 From the HDPQ DataNode Home page, click the Commissioning Setup tab and select WiFi Setup > Join Network.

Result: The following screen is displayed.



To join an existing WiFi network click on the **CONTINUE** button to the right, and proceed to the next steps outlined in this procedure.

NOTE: If you want to connect directly to a computer via WiFi, select **WiFi Setup > Ad Hoc** menu instead. The instrument will prompt you through the next steps.

Step	Action
2	Disconnect from any network to which the instrument is currently connected by pressing the DISCONNECT button to the right.
3	The instrument will attempt to connect to any "remembered" WiFi networks. To clear the list of "remembered" networks, click on CLEAR. Otherwise click on the NEXT button to the right.
4	The list of detected WiFi networks is shown. If your desired wireless network is not found, click on the REFRESH button to the right. Otherwise click on NEXT .
5	Select the network you wish to connect from the available WiFi networks on the dropdown menu and then click on the NEXT button to the right.
6	Provide the required credentials for the WiFi network you are connecting to. Wireless network Authentication and Encryption must be obtained depending on the network you want to connect to.
	Contact your network administrator for assistance if necessary.
	Once you have selected the Encryption method, click on the NEXT button to the right.
7	Enter the Security Key for the WiFi network when prompted and then click on the CONNECT button to the right.
8	If connection to your chosen wireless network is successful, you should see the status change to CONNECTED. Otherwise, the instrument will prompt you to RESTART.

HDPQ IP Setup Program

A proprietary Dranetz setup utility program (HDPQIPSetup.exe) is designed to scan the local network to find and detect HDPQ DataNode units. This allows to you to discover HDPQ DataNodes on your network when you do not know the instrument's IP address. The IP Setup program may be downloaded from the Dranetz website.

The utility program "HDPQIPSetup.exe" is particularly useful when the network is configured for DHCP and the IP address cannot be known until the network DHCP server assigns the IP after initial connection to the network. In this case, the only way to discover the IP address is through the use of the HDPQIPSetup tool.



Follow these steps to use the HDPQIPSetup utility to locate the HDPQ DataNode on your network.


NOTE: You may need Administrator privileges on your computer to run the program since it is an executable (.exe) file.

Step	Action
1	Copy the HDPQIPSetup.exe program to your Windows® computer.
	NOTE: The HDPQIPSetup utility program only runs on Windows® operating systems.
2	Connect the HDPQ DataNode to your computer directly with a cross-over cable via the Ethernet port on the rear panel of the instrument or connect to the same local area network (LAN) of your computer via a router or hub.
3	Double click on the HDPQIPSetup executable file to run the program. Result: The following screen opens.



Once the HDPQ DataNode is set up, connect to the instrument to verify the settings.

NOTE: You may have to change the Internet settings on your computer to connect.

Dranetz Model HDPQ-DN-MVB has four (4) voltage and four (4) current channels which can be wired to measure a variety of circuit connection interfaces.

HDPQ-DN-MVB comes with a voltage cable set for making voltage connections. Current measurements are made using the optional current probes available from Dranetz. Use only Dranetz voltage leads, current probes, and adapter cables for proper operation. Do not exceed the marked maximum ratings.

Voltage Measurement Cables

Voltage Measurement Cables: Voltage measurement cables are provided as standard accessories and are stored in a cable pouch as part of the measurement cable set, P/N VCS-HDPQ (118375-G1). Each cable set consists of a cable and alligator clip.

See page 23 for information on voltage cable connections.

Current Probes

<u>Current Probes (for Current Measurements)</u>: A variety of optional current cables and probes are available.

Typical current probes available from Dranetz are described on page 24.

Connecting Voltage Measurement Cables

Measurement cable set

<u>Description</u>: Voltage measurement cables are used as connectors for voltage input connections via Safety Banana Jack Connectors.

<u>Voltage Rating</u>: Direct connection of all voltage measurement inputs are rated at 600 Vrms max. For measuring voltages greater than 600 Vrms, potential transformers (PTs) must be used.

<u>Contents</u>: A cable set consists of eight (4 black, 4 white) 6-foot voltage measurement cables, each with a detachable alligator jaw safety clip assembly (maximum jaw opening, 3/4 in (20 mm)). There are four (4) black and four (4) white safety clips.

A pouch for storage of the cables and the AC adapter/ battery charger is included in the contents of the measurement cable set.

Wire marker kits

Each kit consisting of snap-on wire markers in various colors is supplied, as described in the following table. These wire markers are to be used to identify each wire connection applicable to your installation.

Connecting Current Probes

Types of current probes

A variety of current measurement probes are available.

The two main types of current probes are listed below. Each type is available in a variety of sizes:

- TR (B Series) clamp-on current probes that provide a broad range of current measurements
- Multiple DRANFLEX (XLB and MHB Series) models powered by the instrument

Probe positioning: The arrow marking on the current probe should be pointed in the direction of current flow and towards the load. In order to reduce measurement errors, it is always 'best practice' to center the conductor in the probe. Correct position of the probe is necessary for correct power measurements, where in-phase voltage and current measurements are necessary.

The following safety precautions apply to current probe connections.

- DO NOT attempt to measure current in any circuit in which the circuit to ground voltage exceeds the insulation rating of the current probe (600 Vrms max).
- Make sure the jaws of the current probe are tightly closed. Keep mating surfaces clean and free from foreign matter.

DO NOT USE non-insulated current probe cores around a non-insulated wire. Probes of this type are designed for use around insulated wires only. Use only completely insulated probe cores with no exposed conductive areas of the core around non-insulated wires.

Refer to the appropriate connection diagram on pages 28 to 35 for the voltage and current probe connections that are required when power measurements are to be made.

Voltage and Current connections

<u>Voltage</u>: Voltage probes are connected to the individual source or load line and are referenced to the return (common) line voltage probe connection for greatest accuracy.

<u>Current</u>: Current probes are connected to each line and positioned to measure currents with reference to the voltage probe. Incorrectly positioned current probes may produce erroneous power measurement. Current probes are always oriented with the arrow pointing to the load.

Phasor diagrams

Correct phasor diagrams (for resistive loads) are shown for each connection.

Phasor displays that show incorrect current probe connection can be corrected by reconnecting the probe so that the arrow on the probe handle points toward the load.

Interconnect jumpers

The standard cable set for the HDPQ-DN-MVB includes four (4) interconnect jumpers bearing P/N 114013-G1. These interconnect jumpers can be used to connect the same conductor points together and are rated 600V CAT III. When using the interconnect jumpers, also use the supplied wire markers to identify the wiring connections applicable to your installation.

WARNINGS

DO NOT EXCEED 600 Vrms when using Dranetz P/N 114013-G1 interconnect jumpers.

For circuit configurations above 600Vrms each voltage channel input is to be individually connected to the HDPQ-DN-MVB instrument with the supplied 1000V CAT III cables and safety clips ONLY.

WARNING

Recommended fuse type is Littelfuse, part number KLKD.300 rated 600V AC/DC, 0.3A fast blow or Dranetz Fuse Voltage Adapter FVA-1K.

Do not replace fuse again if failure is repeated. Repeated failure indicates a defective condition that will not clear with replacement of the fuse. Refer condition to a qualified technician.







Split Phase






3 Phase, Four Wire Wye



3 Phase (Floating or Grounded) Delta






3 Phase, 2-Watt Delta

The figure below shows the 3 Phase 2-Watt delta connection using phase channels A-B-C. Current probes are connected to measure line currents A and B.




The factory-installed digital input option HDPQ-DN-MDIN is an eight channel, digital input module, providing users with the capability to monitor on/off-type digital signals, such as breaker or switch position indicators.

A logical HI condition is when the voltage level goes above 3.0 volts and a logical LO condition is when the voltage level goes below 1.0 volts. The maximum input signal level is 200VDC.

All logic transitions are time stamped to the millisecond and available for simultaneous comparison to all other data collected by the instrument. An "event" can be either set to occur on the change of state (edgetriggered) or at a particular state, HI/LO (level-triggered). Such events can be used to cross-trigger other instruments to also record data.

The Meter screens will report the present state of the inputs.




Each channel 1 through 8 is referenced to the "COM" terminal.
